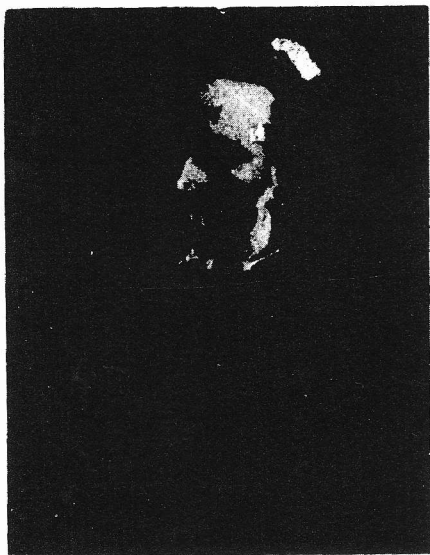


**SAMUEL PEACOCK, M.B.,** Glasgow; L.R.C.S., Edin.; and L.M., Edin.; practising at the corner of Wellington Parade and Simpson Street, East Melbourne, was born in the county of Antrim, Ireland, in 1839, and is a son of Mr. Samuel Peacock, late of Colac, and formerly a farmer of that county. Educated primarily at a National School, and latterly under private tuition, he afterwards proceeded to Glasgow, Scotland, where he entered at the Glasgow University in 1866, taking the degree M.B. in May, 1870. During the same year he also obtained the L.R.C.S. and L.M. of the Royal College of Surgeons, Edin-

burgh. He was then for two years in practice as assistant in England, and came out from London as surgeon of a sailing vessel to Adelaide, S.A., arriving there in August, 1872, and came to Victoria by the boat "Aldinga," landing in Melbourne on the 29th of the same month. Dr. Peacock commenced practice at Bundoora, on the Plenty Road, where he remained for two years, and then removed to Fitzroy, where he resided until 1900. In that year he removed to East Melbourne, where he is at present practising.
